International System of Units (SI)

Prefix	Symbol	Value		
giga-	G	10^9	1,000,000,000	one billion
mega-	M	10^6	1,000,000	one million
kilo-	k	10^3	1,000	one thousand
(none)	(none)	10^0	1	one
centi-	c	10^{-2}	.01	one one-hundredth
milli-	m	10^{-3}	.001	one one-thousandth
micro-	μ	10^{-6}	.000001	one one-millionth
nano-	n	10^{-9}	.000000001	one one-billionth
pico-	p	10^{-12}	.000000000001	one one-trillionth

$$1 \text{ A} = 1000 \text{ mA}$$

$$1 \text{ mA} = 10^{-3} \text{ A}$$

$$1 \text{ mW} = 10^{-3} \text{ W}$$

$$1 \text{ pF} = 10^{-6} \mu\text{F}$$

$$1 \text{ Hz} = 10^{-3} \text{ kHz}$$

$$1 \text{ Hz} = 10^{-6} \text{ MHz}$$

$$1 \text{ Hz} = 10^{-9} \text{ GHz}$$

$$1 \text{ kHz} = 10^{-3} \text{ MHz}$$

$$1 \text{ MHz} = 10^3 \text{ kHz}$$

$$1 \text{ MHz} = 10^{-3} \text{ GHz}$$

Length of 1/2 wavelength antenna:

$$\text{Length (in feet)} = \frac{468}{\text{Frequency (in MHz)}}$$

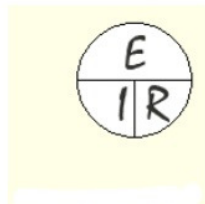
Length of 1/4 wavelength antenna:

$$\text{Length (in feet)} = \frac{234}{\text{Frequency (in MHz)}}$$

Feet to inches:

$$\text{Length (in inches)} = \text{Length (in feet)} \times 12$$

Ohm's law:

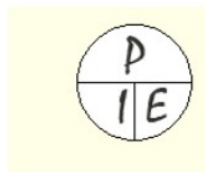


$$E = I \times R$$

$$I = \frac{E}{R}$$

$$R = \frac{E}{I}$$

Power formulas:



$$P = E \times I$$

$$I = \frac{P}{E}$$
